Incoming Second Grade Math Assignments

Over the summer, your child is being asked to complete the two assignments included in this packet. These assignments were created to build upon and enhance important math skills that were learned in first grade and will carry over into second grade. Completing these assignments will allow your child's teacher to assess your child more accurately and design their instructional needs in August.

Activity #1: Addition and Subtraction Basic Facts

A strong sense of basic addition and subtraction facts is critical in second grade. Therefore, it is important to practice and enhance these skills over the summer prior to returning to school.

During the months of June and July, your child will be required to complete online games at the multiplication.com website. At the home page, please select from the Addition Games and Subtraction Games only. Your child is also being provided a packet of flashcards that need to be cut out before being practiced with. We ask that you keep a daily log of your child's math activities to indicate time spent online and/or with the flashcards.

Activity #2: Math Calendar

You will find a math calendar attached to this packet. This assignment is to be completed throughout the month of August. This calendar consists of daily math activities, covering a wide range of skills like addition and subtraction, measurement, and estimation. Please have your child choose 8 activities to complete on the papers provided. The idea is to complete two skills each week in August. Your child will be assessed based on the completion of the following:

- Choose your activity and color in the day on the calendar.
- On the top of each paper, write your name and the date that the activity was completed.
- Draw a picture illustrating your work.
- Write a complete explanation of your answer.

Please have these activities completed and ready to turn in on your first day back to school!
